# Things that you need to know!

#### What lessons will I do?



We do **Numeracy** every day. We learn multiplication, division, addition and subtraction. We learn aspects of Number, Shape and Space, Measures, Data Handling and Financial Capabilities.



We do **Literacy** every day. We learn how to use words and punctuation properly, and how to construct sentences. We learn about the different genres of writing. We enjoy speaking and listening and use phonics to help us read and spell.



In the **World Around Us** we learn how to carry out experiments, and to predict their results. We like to find out how things happen and why. We learn about different countries and cultures in the world, and facts about the Earth. We use atlases, reference books, the Internet and videos to help us learn. We learn about other civilisations such as Ancient Egypt. We also learn about important past events and famous people, like the Victorians and the Titanic.



In **I.C.T.** we explore the 5 E's: Explore, Express, Exchange, Evaluate & Exhibit. We do this through researching topics through the internet, and completing different tasks. All classrooms have an interactive whiteboard so we can use our computer skills in all of our lessons. We have a brilliant computer suite and laptops and ipads.



In **Religious Education** we learn about the life of Jesus and other biblical characters. We have assembly every Friday.



In **P.D.M.U.** we learn about ourselves and other people. The All Stars Programme is used in Y.5 to Y.7.



We study **The Arts.** We learn new songs to sing, and learn to play the recorder. Pupils can volunteer in the school choir. We try and copy pictures by famous artists or experiment with paint, pencil, pastel and crayons! Sometimes we make things out of materials such as clay and use papier mache.

# <u>S.T.E.M.</u>

In Y.5 to Y.7 you will work in small groups on a Wednesday afternoon from 2pm until 3pm. You will complete 7 week courses that are part of our S.T.E.M. programme. This means Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. The courses will include:

- Robotics
- Coding (Computer programming)
- Izak9 (Group Problem Solving)
- Mad Science
- Money Education and 'The Apprentice'
- Eco Education/Gardening/Cooking/Health Education
- Animation/Film Education

# School Trips:

Every year each class goes on different fun and educational trips that are linked with their class topics.

In Y.7 we have a residential to Bushmills Activity Centre. Y.7 stay over for 3 nights and take part in canoeing, abseiling and swimming!

# **School Council:**

The school council is made up of one pupil from every class from Y.4 upwards. They meet every month to discuss the day to day running of the school, from the pupils' point of view. If you have any suggestions on how to make the school a better place, just tell your class representative. The councillors can be recognised by their badges. Our school council also works with the school council from St James' Primary School.

Our 'New Year, New You' week looks at different ways of making sure we are happy and healthy!


#### 'Buddy Classes' & 'Playground Buddies'

# What will I do if I or someone else is being bullied?

We must first understand what we mean by bullying. Working with our school council we defined bullying using four 'P's:

- **Purpose** One or more pupils <u>intending</u> to cause hurt to others.
- **Pattern** One or more pupils <u>repeating</u> behaviour that hurts others.

Serious bullying will also be:

- **Persistent** The bullying behaviour will last for a longer time.
- Planned One or more people will deliberately seek out victims.

The most common forms of bullying in the primary age group include:

- **Physical Bullying** e.g. Pinching, pushing and kicking.
- Emotional Bullying e.g. Name calling and threatening.
- **Social Bullying** e.g. Excluding from games or restricting other children's friendships.
- Cyper Bullying e.g. Misuse of social media or phone 'stalking'.

# What happens if I report being bullied?

You report being bullied in school

You will be listened to carefully. You will be thanked for being brave and told that we will help. Your class teacher will talk with you and other children and adults who may have important information. The teacher will carefully write down notes of the important facts they discover. This will normally happen the same day you report bullying.



The teacher will report this to one of the school leaders e.g. Mr Bailie. The following <u>6 Steps</u> will occur:

<u>Step 1</u>

The pupil who has bullied will complete a sheet 'What I did and how can I make it better?' This is to help them think carefully about the way they have behaved.

#### <u>Step 2</u>

The pupil who has bullied will apologise to you and accept a punishment. This will be a minimum of 3 detention days.

#### Step 3

You will be offered help and support to make you happy again.

Step 4

Both pupils' parents will be contacted to discuss the bullying.

# Step 5

The bullying incident will be carefully recorded in the pupils' school records.

#### <u>Step 6</u>

One month later we will check you are feeling safe and happy in school. The teacher will decide if bullying has occurred.

#### <u>No</u>

The teacher will carefully explain to you why they felt it was not a case of bullying.

However, it can still have been a hurtful or worrying experience.

Sadly, sometimes other people can hurt or upset us by carelessness, lack of thought or just by being unkind. The teacher will deal with these types of behaviour appropriately.
