

Rights Respecting School Flags of the United Nations Quiz



The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child is the document that contains the special rights which children around the world hold.

The United Nations is an organisation made up of 193 countries. They work together to maintain international peace and security, protect human rights, deliver humanitarian aid, promote sustainable development and uphold international law.

Representatives of each member country meet in the UN General Assembly. This is the closest thing we have to a world parliament.

When the General Assembly wants to make a decision, they hold a vote. Each country has a single vote. Decisions that are voted for become resolutions.

Major decisions about things like who can join the UN need the support of two-thirds of the Assembly.

Less important decisions need the support of over half the Assembly.

The Assembly's decisions are not laws. Governments follow resolutions because they represent the world's opinion on important international issues.

Ist place will receive 15 gold coins for their house.


2nd place will receive 10 gold coins.
