As you may know, Whitehouse Primary School is a Silver Level Rights Respecting School. The Rights Respecting Schools Award is granted to schools that show commitment to promoting and realising children's rights and encouraging adults, children and young people to respect the rights of others in school. Silver level is given to schools that make excellent progress towards embedding the principles of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child into its ethos and curriculum.

We are delighted with the progress we have made on our Rights Respecting journey so far and are now ready to be assessed for the Gold Award at the end of September.

Over the next few weeks, we will be sending home a series of house competitions related to the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. This will hopefully give you, and your child, opportunities to learn more about their rights and how they can ensure their rights are respected.

One way we try to ensure pupils' rights are respected in school is through our whole school charter. We are all part of the school community and we all need to work together to ensure rights are respected.
