90+% of pupils, in both, Literacy and Numeracy will achieve as expected or above;


I.C.T. will more effectively enrich creativity, thinking skills and improve school management;

Mitchell Kelly- I love crabs because they can run really fast and they look funny when they run sideways.


Courtney Ashe- Dolphins are really cute and they're really good swimmers and can be trained.
