Happy Healthy Kids - This event will be held at the Methodist Mission on Thursday 16th March. The 'Getting Ready to Learn' events are fantastic and help to promote and engage parents in their child's learning. We would love you to come along with your child. This session will aim to give you an understanding in how to promote health and wellbeing in your child's life and ideas on fine and gross motor activities at home.

Toys in School - Please can we remind parents that toys are not allowed in school. This is something that can cause friction between the other children and unfortunately leads to lost learning time. We would really appreciate your support in this matter.

Footwear - Please can we remind parents to ensure their child is brought into Nursery wearing shoes with Velcro. We try to promote independence wear possible and feel it is important that they fasten their own shoes. Laces can restrict this independence which is so crucial at this age. Thank you for your understanding.

Tissues - We are running very low so if anyone could provide Nursery with spare boxes of tissues, we would really appreciate it!

Fund Money - Thank you for being so great with dinner and fund money. Please can you keep an eye each week to make sure your fund money is paid and up to date. If you are ever unsure, a member of Nursery staff will be happy to check for you. If you are sending both fund and dinner money at the same time, please can this be in 2 separate envelopes. It really helps us with the logistics of sorting it out each week.

If you wish to come in and help out especially this term leading towards lovely Easter activities just let us know. It would be much appreciated. We are also keen to have visitors who would enjoy spending some time in the book area sharing books with the children.

Clothing and Belongings
